This is what the Lord God showed me: the Lord was  
standing beside a wall built with a plumb line, with a plumb  
line in his hand. And the LORD said to me, "Amos, what do  
you see?" And I said, "A plumb line." Then the Lord said,  
"See, I am setting a plumb line in the midst of my  
people Israel; I will never again pass them by;  
the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate,

Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good  
work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. May you  
be made strong with all the strength that comes from his  
glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure  
everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to  
the Father, who has enabled you to share in the  
inheritance of the saints in the light. He has rescued us  
from the power of darkness and transferred us into the  
kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption,

The Gospel

Luke 10:25-37

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke  
The people respond: *Glory to you, Lord Christ.*

Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN.*
