



Youth Ministry Coordinator and

McKenzie Bade Youth Ministry Coordinator

In the last year, Province V has welcomed both a new Youth Ministry Coordinator and a new Young Adult and Campus Ministries Coordinator. As of this fall, Youth Ministry is now coordinated by Ms. McKenzie Bade, who is the Facilitator of Youth and Young Adult Networks in the Diocese of Eastern Michigan. The Rev. Beth Scriven, who is the Chaplain at Rockwell House Episcopal Campus Ministry in St. Louis, has recently taken up the coordinator role for Young Adult and Campus Ministries. We are grateful they are stepping into this role and excited for their leadership.

The Province V Youth Ministry Network exists to equip those who minister with youth at the diocesan level, and to create stronger, healthier youth ministries throughout the province. The network provides opportunities for congregations and dioceses to connect to the wider Episcopal Church through events like General Convention, the Episcopal Youth Event, Diocesan Youth Leader Gathering, and the Provincial Youth Event. The network is comprised of diocesan youth coordinators from each diocese in the province, whether they are paid members of diocesan staff or volunteers engaged in diocesan youth ministry. The network hosts regular meetings by video conference call for members to check in, discuss best practices, and to collaborate. The Province V Young Adult and Campus Ministries Network serves to connect those working professionally in campus and/or young adult ministries, whether in parishes, on diocesan staffs, as standalone chaplains, or in innovative new contexts. Network members meet quarterly by video chat to check in and collaborate, as well as hosting an annual chaplains' gathering in October and a gathering of students and young adults every February. Like the Youth Ministry network, the YACM network also helps its members to connect to the wider Episcopal Church through such events as the annual YACM professionals conference and the Young Adult Festival at General Convention. if you would like to learn more about Provincial YACM Ministry, please contact Beth at beth@rockwellhouse.org.

The 2020 United Thank Offering <u>grant application materials are now available</u>. The focus of the 2020 UTO grants will be Bless - share faith, practice generosity and compassion, and proclaim the Good News of God in Christ with hope and humility.

United Thank Offering - 2020 Young Adult and Seminarian Grants

The United Thank Offering (UTO) Board is now accepting applications for up to five Young Adult Grants and up to five Seminarian Grants for 2020. Seminarian Grants are open to any ordination track Episcopal students at any school or training program approved by your sponsoring Bishop or Diocese. Grants will be up to \$5,000 each to fund start-up costs for new projects. Review the details here.

Final applications from bishops should be received by Friday, February 7, 2020, at 5 p.m. Eastern Time. Applicants will be notified of their awards in June 2020.

2020 Roanridge Trust grants available

Applications are now being accepted for the <u>2020 Roanridge Trust Grant Awards</u>. Dioceses, congregations and Episcopal Church related organizations and institutions are invited to apply.

Offered annually, Roanridge Trust Grants are used for the "training of town and country ministry and rural Christian workers" of The Episcopal Church. They support creative models of leadership development and training of the laity and clergy in small towns and rural communities across The Episcopal Church. Awards generally range from \$5,000 to \$20,000.
